5. A copy of your CV, your matric certificate, your latest university transcript and a copy of your Identity Document must be attached to your application form.
6. Applications with copies of accompanying documentation may be emailed, faxed or delivered personally – see contact details given on page 4 of this form.
7. If you are short-listed, you will be required to undergo an interview before the final decision by the Board of Trustees is made.
8. Your *original* matric certificate, latest university transcript and ID should be presented at your interview.
9. The Trustees' decision regarding your application is final and no correspondence will be entered into or telephonic enquiries responded to.
